

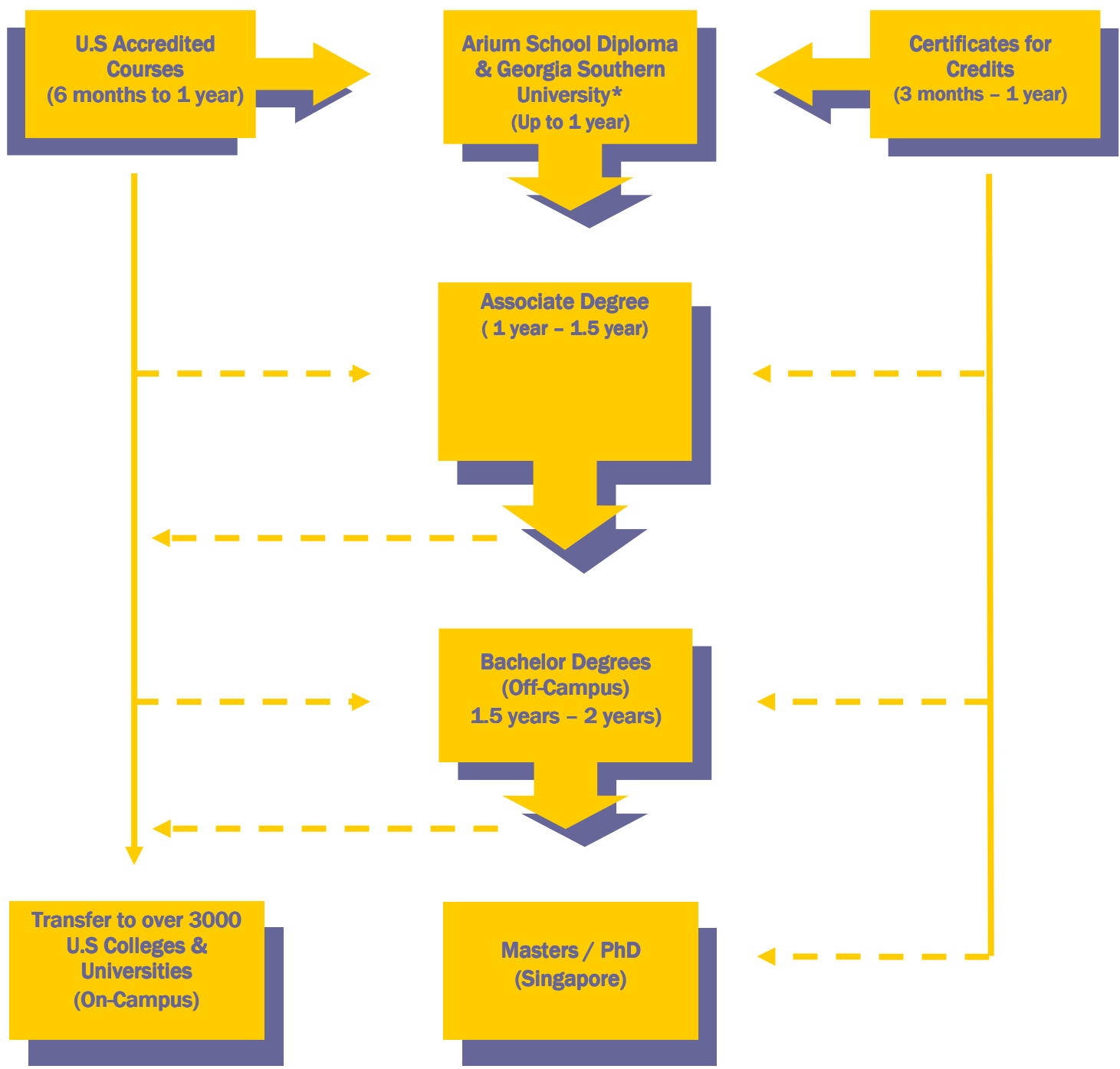
Academic Path **AMERICAN DIPLOMA PROGRAM**

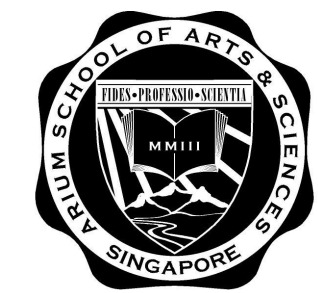
