Areas of Study

- Psychology Studies

By studying psychology, you can explore many facets of human experience, from development, learning and memory to social interactions and the physiological underpinnings of these phenomena. Study in Psychology offers a more thorough understanding of yourself and others. The study of psychology helps to develop your knowledge and understanding of human behavior. There are four reasons why this knowledge will be beneficial to you.

- The first is that you will better understand yourself and your environment. In other words, the study of psychology will enhance your life through the value of human interaction & behavior.
- The second reason for studying psychology is to prepare for a career in psychology or to acquire skills that will improve your performance in other careers, such as business, social work, law enforcement or teaching etc.
- The third reason for studying psychology at the diploma level is to prepare for undergraduate study in psychology or related fields such as social work, or counseling.
- The fourth reason empowers you to appreciate the differing fields of this discipline such as Child psychology, Education psychology, Industrial psychology, Sports psychology, Counseling etc. The diploma comes with a number of emphases and you can choose your specific area of interest.

- Criminology Studies

The scientific study of criminals and criminal behavior is called criminology. In this field, criminologists usually endeavor to construct theories that clarify why crimes occur and examine those theories by observing behavior. Criminological theories help outline society's response to crime both in terms of preventing criminal behavior and responding to it after it occurs. The criminology program entails the study of why people commit crime, why crime rates vary geographically and historically in the United States, and how societies can react to crime to prevent its vicious consequences.

- **Sociology Studies / Social Science**

Sociology examines the fundamental social factors and social institutions that shape our everyday life and create the type of society in which we live. Sociologists study such diverse topics as poverty, family relationships, crime and delinquency, the mass media, minority groups, education, ethnicity and health care. As sociologists study these areas, they are interested in how different groups of people are influenced. They are concerned in the effect these factors have relative to one's race, sex, age, and social class. In other words, what is the association between social class and health outcomes, the likelihood of divorces, poverty, single-parenthood, poor health and so forth.

- **Business Studies**

Most organizations in the world are business organizations.
